

We start off this series with a virtual chat with **bro Lawrence Sia** who was baptized in Nov 2019.

Farand:

Hi Lawrence, to start with, can you briefly introduce yourself?



Lawrence:

I'm Lawrence, was Taiwanese, I spent some time later in Taiwan, then finished my degree in the Philippines, and moved Singapore after that. I used to be an IT Project Manager, later on I ventured out in my own business with Precious. We quit our jobs and now spend most of our time with our family with flexible work schedule. Our kids are Tiffany and Xavier. Tiffany is studying P1 in Red Swastika School, and Xavier is studying N2 in Paper Scissors Stone Montessori.

Farand:

What sort of business are you running? And how long have you been in Singapore?

Lawrence:

We are distributing cellular nutrition, and I've been here since 2007, turning 13 years in October

Farand:

Your background is actually really interesting. Extended period living in Taiwan, Philippines and Singapore. Is there a particular culture/country you identify with? What languages do you speak? How would you compare living in Singapore with the other countries?

Lawrence:

Haha, yeah, it is really a big mixture. For food and culture. I'm still toward the Taiwanese side, other than that, I love Singapore, that's why we've decided to stay here permanently. Yes, I can speak Mandarin, Tagalog and English, for Hokkien - it is roughly 60% due lack of practice.Living in Singapore is really good, I love the efficiency of government. And the best part is I feel safe to stay here.

Farand:

Where do you get your Taiwanese food fix in Singapore?

Lawrence:

Usually I buy ready made from food stalls, still like the street foods [] 士林 (Shilin), or any 炸雞 排 (Fried chicken cutlet)

Farand:

Haha that's quite mainstream.. Was hoping for a more obscure secret tip

Lawrence:

Hahaha, don't really have a lot of choices, but of course Din Tai Fung is also good

Farand:

How has the circuit breaker been for you and the family? How are you coping personally and with the kids?

Lawrence:

Circuit breaker actually gives us challenges both and opportunities. We chose to focus on the opportunities, which is business making our more "online proof". It is also fun to become a teacher, a fitness instructor, a barber, and a baker during this time @ a lot of unexpected circumstances, but overall still a big blessing from God ∏

Farand:

The teacher, fitness instructor and barber are all for the kids?

Lawrence:

Haha yeah, mostly for them &

Farand:

Also, what do you bake?

Lawrence:

Haha, something like Famous Amos cookies

(side note: Lawrence did mention he might bring the cookies to church after the circuit breaker period ©)

Farand:

Outside of the circuit breaker, what usually occupies you, besides work and family?

Lawrence:

I love playing table tennis, tennis, bowling and billiards. I watch some shows during my free time too.

Farand:

What shows are you watching nowadays?

Lawrence:

Supergirl, Dragonball Super Manga, or any good movies together with the kids

Farand:

Moving to more spiritual things -Could you describe your journey to baptism?

Lawrence:

When I was young (still in Taiwan), my mom was with Jehovah's Witness, so somehow, I had some exposure to Bible stories and about Jesus. But later on, our life was not really good, that is why we moved to the Philippines. At that time, almost everyone in the household was busy with their

own stuffs, so we didn't have the chance to worship or have any form of Bible study. I stayed in the Philippines for 13 years then moved to Singapore. I came to Singapore alone, main reason was just to look for a better career opportunity, I didn't think much about the spiritual side at that time, because my career is good, life in Singapore is also good, spiritual growth was not something relevant to me. There is even a time I consider myself "Free Thinker".

After a few years in Singapore, that was the time I met Precious. Precious was member of Church of Christ in Pasir Panjang, and even in the Philippines, she was already with the Church of Christ. Sometimes, I went to church with her in Pasir Panjang, but I didn't understand the still purpose of worship and spiritual growth, although she was frequently sharing with me the importance of salvation.

Being a Free Thinker, I was open to learn more about anything, that includes the Bible. Since I wanted to learn more, I started to include "searching the truth" in my prayer. I wanted God to lead

me to the truth, and I was even asking for "signs" from God. One day, I saw a post from my cousin, who was a pastor from a mega church in the Philippines. His post said "Don't say God has been silent if your Bible has been closed". It really touched me, and that's the time I decided to read the Bible and learn more. In Pasir Panjang Church of Christ, they arranged a weekly Bible study session for me with some of the church leaders, then after few months, I had a clearer picture about the Bible.

On the journey of my Bible study, we had a guest at our place, Jozel. He is a family friend of Precious, and he introduced Stephanie and Ernest to us. After a few months, we decided to give it a try to have our Sunday service in LAPCOC.

In our first visit in LAPCOC, I had a good feeling about the church. Although the building is not as fancy as PPCOC, but the people are very warm, and I can feel the presence of the family in LAPCOC. On top of that, I started some great Bible study sessions with Ernest, I've really learnt a lot from him, and he was able to answer all my questions. After his series of Bible study, I had my Bible study with the elder Jimmy. After a few sessions, I decided to be baptized and follow Christ. Thank God, He really guided me to the right people for me to find the truth.

Farand:

Thank you for the thoughtful reply. It's heartening to know that you had wanted to learn more and read the Bible on your own accord. When you got baptized, was it a particular event that sparked that decision or something that you were building up to for a while beforehand?

Lawrence:


I think it was both, I really want to be baptized before 2020, and that moment Uncle Jimmy really touched on it.

As a father of 2, has Christianity changed the way you parent? What's the one thing you would want them to learn about Christ/Christianity?

Lawrence:

Yes, we put God at the center of our family. I want them to be God fearing and living in Christian values. Actually that is one of the reasons that I wanted to study more about the Bible, because I know it is really tough if the parents have different values or beliefs. Children will be confused. Good that God gave me the chance to catch up []


